Greetings to you in the name of Christ Jesus our Lord

I've had a specific song from the Taizé community in my head over the past few days. It begins with the simple phrase Prepare the way of the Lord, Prepare the way of the Lord, and all people will see the salvation of our God. This simple chorus grows into a round that ends with shouts of Alleluia from all participants. This advent season reminds me a lot of the progression of this song. It begins as a faint whisper and ends in a full roar as we mark the inbreaking of God enfleshed in Christ into creation. This Advent season the church is offering midweek services Wednesday evenings at 5 pm. We will gather in the sanctuary, sing and pray, and study God's word to us through the ancient texts of the O

Antiphons. Due to this being a special seasonal event Lutheranism 101 will be moved to Thursdays at 2pm for the time being. On December 21<sup>st</sup> we will be gathering for an Advent lessons and carols service where we will hear God's word, sing our praise, and hear some voices from the congregation reflect on what the advent season means to them. Finally, starting the first weekend in December a sign up sheet will be in the welcome center for poinsettias for Christmas. Like years past we are asking you purchase either a red or white plant and then have it to the church no later than December 24<sup>th</sup>.

Finally I wish to extend my thanks and gratitude to Bryan and Charlie for their leadership and mentorship over these past years. They've both served on council since I arrived in 2018 and their love of God has shown through their time in leading God's people at St. Matthew Lutheran. They will be greatly missed and I look forward to how they will still bless our congregation in the years to come. As we prepare to lead the

congregation with a fresh council with fresh faces I am hopeful for the year ahead. God's will WILL be done, and we are just getting started.


Korte, Deb Hyland and Gary Appel for agreeing to join the Council and help to lead us over the next year with the rest of the Council members.




