#### President's Letter February 2022

#### Greetings to all!

We began our worship services this month of with our new green paraments that we will be using for the seasons of Epiphany and following Pentecost. The new purple paraments for the Lenten season are being prepared and we should have them in time for Ash Wednesday worship. They are a beautiful addition to our historic church. If anyone has suggestions on what to do with our previous paraments, please let a Council member know your thoughts.

Speaking of Lent, Pastor Blake and the Council will be developing plans for activities during the Lenten season. Nothing is final as I write, but expect to hear more over the next couple of weeks.

As I mentioned in my January letter, the Council will be meeting to review and update the congregation's Strategic Plan later this month. This is a vitally important activity in the life of this congregation, so everyone's input would be greatly appreciated. The updated plan is intended to (i) give us a snap-shop of where we are as a congregation based on a number of criteria such as membership participation, outreach activity, financial health, etc.; (ii) develop a vision of where we as a congregation want to be in five years or so in the future (i.e., how we perceive *ourselves* as a Galena, Illinois- based congregation of believers in Christ, as well as how we are perceived by *others* as a Galena, Illinois-based congregation of believers in Christ; and, (iii) what actions we need to take to take going forward to make that vision a reality. The Council is already receiving thoughts from some members who are not on the Council. I strongly encourage everyone to share your thoughts and ideas with any Council member so that we can develop the vision and activities that all of us can get behind and actively support going forward.

Now, a housekeeping item to bring up. We are having issues with the church's backdoor not fully closing and locking. Kathy Marsden, and Charlie, have been working with Roger Johnson to troubleshoot the problem. They have a working theory, but it will not be implemented or proven out until March. So

until then we ask that anyone who enters or exits the back door to please ensure that the door is fully

closed. The locking pin at the bottom of the door will work properly only when you push the panic bar. So

please take your time entering and exiting to ensure the door is closed and locked.

In closing, the Council will be finalizing our Ministries of the Month this February. Although

suggestions for new ministries may be suggested throughout the year, and we have made mid-year

corrections in the past, we would really appreciate any suggestions you have for consideration at this


time.
