
Letter from the Pastor

Greetings to all!

The last week of February members of the Council met for three hours on a Saturday afternoon to review the church's Strategic Plan that the congregation approved in January 2018. To prepare the Strategic Plan, members of the original committee performed a self-evaluation of our church as it existed in 2017 in the following areas:

- Discipleship and Ministry
- Leadership
- Financial and Stewardship
- Physical Conditions and Meeting of Needs

The committee then proposed action items to accomplish in order to achieve what we wanted to be as a congregation 3, 5, and 10 years into the future. As we reviewed the plan last week, we were pleasantly surprised at how much progress we have made over the last four years. With the intervention of the COVID-19 pandemic two years ago, we recognized we have been limited in our ability to work together as planned to achieve other goals. The consensus of the Council coming out of the review is to renew and refocus our efforts on discipleship and ministry areas of the Strategic Plan, while building on the significant progress achieved in the other areas. The Council will start this review with our March meeting, and we have committed to increasing our communication with the congregation as we move forward. We encourage any member with comments or suggestions on any of the areas covered in the Strategic Plan to please contact a member of the Council. We are always looking for additional input.

As a reminder, each Wednesday during this Lenten season we will be hosting a simple meal followed by a presentation of the Alpha Course, a program to reintroduce us to the Christian faith. We encourage everyone interested to attend, enjoy the fellowship with our church family and friends, and participate in the discussion as we renew our faith and discipleship. You are certainly invited to attend

any one or all of the Wednesday programs even if you were unable to sign up in the church's Welcome Center. The meal starts at 5:30 with the program to begin shortly thereafter.

With that, looking forward to seeing all of you in church again soon.
